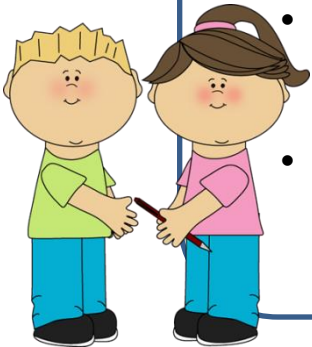


In Reception children are learning:

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

- To be resilient and keep trying when challenges occur
- To build respectful relationships
- To understand and talk about our feelings and behaviour and that of others.
- To manage their own feelings and behaviour



Communication and Language

- To learn and use new vocabulary
- To talk about events in detail and in sequence
- To listen to stories and talk about them
- To retell familiar stories
- To enjoy fiction and non fiction books
- To learn rhymes, poems and songs

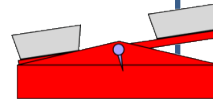
Physical Development

- To move with increasing skill and control in a range of ways, such as hopping, skipping and jumping.
- To use a range of balls, beanbags, hoops and other equipment with increasing control.
- To hold a pencil with good control and use it to form letters correctly.
- To know how to stay fit and healthy.



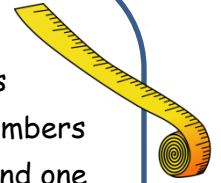
Literacy

- To recognise the single letters and say the sounds made by them
- Learn the single sounds made by more than one letter (i.e. sh, ch, oo)
- To hear and say sounds in the words and use these to write words and sentences.
- To blend sounds together to read words and sentences
- Form letters correctly
- Use capital letters and full stops



Mathematics

- To count actions, objects and sounds
- To count beyond ten and compare numbers
- To understand and recall one more and one less.
- To recall number bonds to ten
- To play with, sort, name and describe a range of shapes
- To continue, copy and create repeating patterns
- To compare length, weight and capacity



Understanding the World

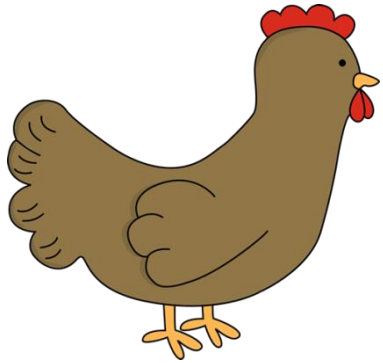
- To talk about their own family and community
- To comment on images from the past
- To understand that some people have different beliefs and ways of celebrating
- To explore the natural world.
- To compare different environments
- To describe what they see, hear and feel whilst outside



Expressive Arts and Design

- To create as part of a group, sharing resources and ideas
- To discuss their feelings and responses to music
- To create narratives in their play
- To make music and dance
- To sing songs, matching the pitch and melody
